### Diploma in Catholic Education

The Diploma in Catholic Education at St Patrick's College, Maynooth, is an initiative borne out of the Alliance for Catholic Education (ACE) programme, administered by the University of Notre Dame, South Bend, Indiana, USA.

#### The Commitment:

- A weekly evening class
- A community gathering once a month
- Retreat experiences
- A fortnight's summer school in the west of Ireland



This programme is intended to enhance the participant's formation as teachers in Catholic schools. The coming together of expertise and experiences of these two institutions is an innovative, exciting and vibrant synergy.

St Patrick's is perfectly placed to offer the Diploma in Catholic Education, as it has been at the heart of the Catholic Church in Ireland since 1795. This programme seeks to encourage and support committed and enthusiastic teachers to be aware of their own faith and how it should impact their role as educators in Catholic schools. #### The programme is designed to:

## Pillars of the Programme

#### **PROFESSIONALISM**

Participants undertake classes at St Patrick's College, Maynooth that continues their formation as Catholic schoolteachers. As a capstone experience to the Diploma in Catholic Education, students will participate in a two-week summer school in the west of Ireland.

#### **SPIRITUALITY**

Participants in the programme will be encouraged to develop spiritually in the context of community. This will be achieved through:


- Three retreat experiences
  - Opening retreat in October
  - Lenten retreat
  - Closing retreat in June
- Monthly opportunities for Mass and prayer
  - Students will meet with the Community Chaplain and Supervisor once a month for Mass and a social evening in St Patrick's College.

#### **COMMUNITY**

The participants in the Diploma in Catholic Education will be asked to form a community outside the academic component of the programme. Students will be required to meet monthly to celebrate Mass and dinner with the Community Chaplain and the Community Supervisor.
